Speech by Ms. Bahar Muradova, Chair of the State Committee for Family, Women, and Children Affairs, on the topic 'Youth Leadership in Climate Resilience and Peacebuilding'

Youth leadership should not be limited to individual initiatives. Listening to their voices, embracing their ideas, and involving them in decision-making processes means preparing for a more sustainable and fair future.

The environmental situation is a key component of the country's long-term development strategy. Extensive efforts are being made to address environmental issues in Azerbaijan.

A number of important state programs, socio-economic development strategies, and large-scale action plans for the efficient use of resources are being implemented.

Extensive restoration and reconstruction efforts, landmine clearance, and the rebuilding of territories based on a unified concept such as 'smart city' and 'smart village' are being carried out in the liberated areas.

Young people, working together with local communities, implement projects in the fields of nature conservation and waste management, create startups.

Modern youth, by participating in various international climate events and conferences, represent their country's climate policy and collaborate with global youth. I am sure that, this encourages their knowledge exchange and networking.
